

Monitoring of Xenophobia and Extremism in Ukraine November 2016

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Introduction

November was marked by a variety of protest actions, especially in the center of Kiev. However, attempts to use the various opposition forces for unwinding massive protests and accusations of the National Bank of Ukraine in the large-scale frauds, and the tariff issue, were not successful. Protests by the National Bank look artificial, with clearly paid crowd scenes. Various political action - against right-wing radicals and militant patriots, street self-presentation a new political movement Saakashvili - look more natural.

The paradox of the political situation in Ukraine in November – attempts to organize mass and sharp protests failed on a background of shocking obvious factors that influence the social and political spheres of life.

In early November, there was an obvious political shock of the content of e-declarations, filed in late October by our officials, MPs, judges. In late November, millions of Ukrainians were in shock due to the bills for centralized heating.

Mikheil Saakashvili announced resignation from the post of the head of the Odessa Regional State Administration and his move to opposition to President Poroshenko. Khatia Dekanoidze resigns as Ukraine's National Police chief.

In the US presidential election won Donald Trump. No one (including D.Tramp) can not now say specifically what new foreign policy of the US President towards Ukraine would be.

Another ambiguous foreign policy challenge for Ukraine in November was hanging with the decision to grant Ukraine visa-free status in its relations with the EU.

Viktor Yanukovych was questioned via video link from Rostov.

The military situation in the ATO zone is very ambiguous. There has not been a large-scale military escalation. But bursts of attacks occur periodically, including the use of heavy weapons, especially in the direction of Mariupol. In Lugansk area the situation has worsen. There is no progress in the talks at the Trilateral contact group in Minsk. The explanation is very simple - the Russian leadership is not ready for a productive compromise.

Prognosis

42% of Ukrainians want early parliament election – poll, 01.11.2016

As of September this year, 42% of the population in Ukraine said they would support early elections to the Verkhovna Rada, the country's parliament, according to a public opinion poll conducted by Rating Group Ukraine at the request of the International Republican Institute. At the same time, 64% would go to vote if the snap parliamentary elections took place. In particular, 18% of those polls expressed unequivocal support for the idea of holding the early vote for parliament in Ukraine, another 24% said they would rather support than skip it. Some 18% of the pollees said they were "undecided."

Poll Shows More Ukrainians Support NATO, Dislike Russia, 01.11.2016

The survey showed that 43%t of respondents would vote "yes" in a referendum on Ukraine's accession to NATO, up from 39% in a June poll. Some 29% said they were against Kyiv joining the military alliance, with 17% saying they were undecided and 11% indicating they would not vote. 57% describe themselves as having either "cold" or "very cold" feelings toward Russia. The poll -- conducted by the Rating Group Ukraine on behalf of the U.S.-based International Republican Institute (IRI) and funded by the Canadian government -- also showed dissatisfaction with the Ukrainian government's handling of economic and corruption issues. http://www.rferl.org/a/ukraine-poll-more-for-nato-against-russia/28089250.html

Ukraine rebuilds navy, with U.S. help, to counter Russian build-up in Crimea, 02.11.2016 Ukraine is refitting and expanding its naval fleet, including repairing its flagship, the frigate "Hetman Sahaydachnyy", to counter a Russian military build-up in the annexed territory of Crimea. The upgrade will be helped by \$30 million worth of U.S. aid, part of a \$500 million package from Washington for the Ukrainian military which Kiev expects to receive next year. Ukraine NSDC chief: Crimea de-occupation "death sentence" for Putin, 04.11.2016
"Putin and his entourage are not OK with an independent democratic Ukraine. For them, a strong Ukraine is the coffin of their regime. Therefore, when they say that we can negotiate a deal with Putin, I do not believe it," said Turchynov. He believes that there is no alternative to the Minsk process. "Yet it is the only platform that allows applying diplomatic and political methods of influence on the RF," said the NSDC secretary. He does not rule out that "the time will come when, disfigured by the economic and political leprosy, a degrading Grandmother Russia will crawl to us to beg for negotiations on a peaceful format of [the conflict] solution". "To this end, it is necessary that the sanctions system be enhanced, while the unity of Europe persist. The new U.S. administration should feel its responsibility for the processes which had started way before, when the US was in their center. They are considered particularly provocative given the emphasis Putin has placed on the Soviet role in the WWII defeat of Nazi Germany.

Huge Nato land army to meet Russian aggression, 07.11.2016

Hundreds of thousands of Nato troops will be put on a higher state of alert amid growing tensions with Russia, the head of the alliance has indicated. Nato commanders want to prepare a substantial land force capable of deterring Russian aggression. Jens Stoltenberg, the alliance's secretary-general, did not give precise figures, but Sir Adam Thomson, Britain's outgoing permanent representative to Nato, said he thought that the goal was to speed up the response time of up to 300,000 military personnel to about two months. At present a force of this size could take up to 180 days to deploy.

The troops would act as a "follow-on force" to Nato's existing response force, which can be deployed to a warzone within days.

Pledging unwavering defence, NATO braces for Trump, 09.11.2016

NATO promised to defend all allies despite election victor Donald Trump's call to set conditions for U.S. help, as the alliance braced for a more impulsive leader some fear could withdraw funding to deter Russia. During the presidential election campaign Trump threatened to abandon U.S. allies in Europe if they do not spend enough on defense, comments that were particularly unnerving for the ex-Soviet Baltic states on Russia's border which fear Moscow might try a repeat of its 2014 annexation of Ukraine's Crimea. NATO Secretary-General Jens Stoltenberg said NATO's promise to defend any ally under attack was an unconditional guarantee set out in the Western alliance's founding treaty in 1949. "All allies have made a solemn commitment to defend each other and this is something which is absolute and unconditioned," Stoltenberg told a news conference, saying he would try to speak to Trump by telephone as soon as possible and would welcome him to a NATO summit in Brussels next year.

U.S. army to continue supporting Ukraine no matter who is elected president - Gen. Hodges, 07.11.2016

Gen. Hodges repeatedly emphasized that support in Congress for Ukraine has been bipartisan and stability in Europe is unquestionably in America's economic and national-security interests, according to WSJ. Speaking to reporters in Lviv, Gen. Hodges noted that supporting Ukraine with non-lethal military assistance has received bipartisan support in Congress. "No matter who is president. No matter who controls Congress, the United States is always going to be interested and need security and stability in Europe," Gen. Hodges said. Gen. Hodges and other U.S. military leaders were in Ukraine reviewing the international training effort and the overhaul of its military medicine. A range of U.S. military officials have noted they have taken a number of steps to demonstrate a renewed commitment to European defense, including the decision to send an armored infantry brigade to the continent early next year, build up stocks of military equipment and to participate in the North Atlantic Treaty Organization buildup of forces in Poland and the Baltic States. Gen. Hodges, who is expected to remain in command of U.S. Army forces in Europe through the summer, said the military has plans to rotate in new trainers and hold a series of large exercises in the Black Sea region.

"According to information obtained from inside Russia by Western intelligence, Putin met with Yanukovych in secret near Volgograd, formerly known as Stalingrad. Yanukovych assured Putin there was no documentary trail showing payments to Manafort, although Putin told associates he did not believe the Ukrainian president, according to the information obtained by the Western intelligence source,"

Kremlin recalls conditions of "unfreezing" conflict with Ukraine, 08.11.2016

"Russia is interested in resolving the conflict near its borders more than anyone else, despite the fact that you have periodically heard the assertions that we want to artificially protract this conflict preserving it in such a frozen state forever. These are the attempts to shift the blame on someone else," Lavrov said speaking at Alexander Gorchakov Public Diplomacy Fund. Lavrov said the sides needed to make efforts to restore mutual trust, which had been severed due to the Ukrainian crisis. "We all agree that the speedy and full implementation of the Minsk agreements remains on the agenda, under which Kyiv assumed specific obligations to grant special status to Donbas, enshrining this in the Constitution of Ukraine, to adopt an amnesty law, to hold local elections," Lavrov said. "I emphasize that we are talking about basic European standards providing for citizens' right to local self-government, to freely use their native language," he added. Lavrov believes that the attempts to isolate Russia have repeatedly led to serious consequences for the whole Europe. According to him, it is no longer possible to create some islands of security in today's interconnected world.

EU agrees new sanctions against Crimea officials, EU's presidency says, 08.11.2016

European Union finance ministers agreed on Tuesday new targeted sanctions against Crimean officials, adding to restrictive measures adopted after Russia's annexation of Crimea in 2014. "The Council adopted new listings under the restrictive measures in respect of actions undermining Ukraine's territorial integrity," Slovakia's Finance Minister Peter Kazimir told a news conference at the end of a meeting of the Council of EU finance ministers. He was replying to a question on whether new sanctions have been imposed on Crimean officials. Slovakia holds the rotating presidency of the EU until the end of the year. A list of 151 people and 37 entities are already subject to visa bans and an assets freeze in the EU for their role in the annexation of Crimea or the Russia-backed rebellion in eastern Ukraine.

Ukraine submits to UN draft resolution on Crimea, Russia expected to oppose, 09.11.2016

"I have the honor to submit the draft resolution entitled 'Situation of human rights in the Autonomous Republic of Crimea and the city of Sevastopol.' The draft resolution is based on the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, international human rights treaties and other relevant international instruments and declarations," Yelchenko said. 38 delegations became co-authors of the draft resolution. The document proposes to condemn human rights abuses, discriminatory measures and practices by Russian occupation authorities against residents of the temporarily occupied territory of Crimea, including the Crimean Tatars and Ukrainians, and persons belonging to other ethnic and religious groups.

"Trump['s entourage] has got many pro-Russian representatives who can be tapped to head major security agencies. But there are people beside him who stand for arming Ukraine. It's not that unambiguous," she U.S.-based Ukrainian journalist Myroslava Gongadze said. Detention of "saboteurs" in Crimea may freeze talks on prisoner swap – Feygin, 10.11.2016 "Isn't it strange that this coincided with some global events like the U.S. election and the statement of one of the [presidential] candidates on possibility of talks on Crimea and the recognition of its annexation. It seems that the situation is being ramped up politically. I am convinced that this is yet another fake story," Feygin said. In his opinion, such events always have political consequences. "For example, the freezing of all talks on humanitarian exchange. Now in the wake of these new, so to speak, 'saboteurs', it becomes problematic to talk about the exchange of Sentsov, Kolchenko, Karpiuk, and Klykh," the lawyer said. He also said that "the Crimean saboteurs" detained in August were transferred to Moscow's Lefortovo pretrial detention facility, where Ukrainian journalist Roman Sushchenko, who has been accused of spying, is also held in custody.

Canada says Russian sanctions must be upheld by all countries, 11.11.2016

Canadian Foreign Minister Stephane Dion on Friday urged all countries to remain firm about upholding sanctions against Russia for its actions toward Ukraine and said Canada will not ease them as long as Moscow keeps its current stance. Dion's comments came three days after businessman Donald Trump won the U.S. presidential election after a campaign in which he praised Russian President Vladimir Putin. "The behavior of Russia in Ukraine and Syria is problematic to say the least. Because of that, it is important to be very frank in our relationship with Russia," Dion said. "About Ukraine, there are sanctions that are existing and Canada is insisting that all countries must be very firm about these sanctions," Dion added. Mogherini warns against "black and white" representations of EU-Russia relations, 14.11.2016

I can say there is unity among all the twenty eight on the need first of all, to continue working on the strength of the transatlantic relation. Treasury Sanctions Individuals for Activities Related to Russia's Occupation of Crimea, 14.11.2016

The U.S. Department of the Treasury's Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC) today designated six individuals who represent Crimea and Sevastopol in the Russian State Duma (Parliament). Specifically, OFAC designated Dmitry Belik, Andrey Kozenko, Konstantin Bakharev, Svetlana Savchenko, Ruslan Balbek, and Pavel Shperov pursuant to Executive Order 13660 for being responsible for or complicit in actions or policies that undermine democratic processes or institutions in Ukraine and actions or policies that threaten the peace, security, stability, sovereignty, or territorial integrity of Ukraine. Last week, the EU also designated these six individuals. These actions support the U.S. commitment to seek a diplomatic resolution to the crisis in Ukraine by maintaining our sanctions on Russia and to further align U.S. measures with those of our international partners. These steps also demonstrate our sustained commitment to a policy of non-recognition with respect to Russia's purported annexation of Crimea, and our intent to maintain Crimea-related sanctions until Russia ends its occupation of the peninsula. "The United States does not recognize the illegitimate elections to the Russian State Duma that took place in Crimea," said John E. Smith, Acting OFAC Director. "Today's action was closely coordinated with the EU, underscoring the strength of the U.S.-EU partnership in maintaining pressure on Russia until it respects the security and sovereignty of Ukraine. Trump, Putin and Grudging Reformers Tip Ukraine Closer to Russia, 15.11.2016

In Ukraine, ever on the fault line between Russian power and western influence, the prospect of losing Uncle Sam's protection under a new U.S. president is bad enough. The more immediate loss may be "Uncle Joe." U.S. Vice President Joe Biden has been essential to cajoling the government in Kiev to keep up with the economic and anti-corruption reform commitments in the International Monetary Fund's bailout package, together with successive U.S. ambassadors and the European Union. The IMF program underpins all the foreign aid on which Ukraine depends. With President-elect Donald Trump taking office in January, that American engagement looks set to wane. A Trump administration thaw with Russia is 'unacceptable,' McCain says, 16.11.2016 Sen. John McCain, the chairman of the Senate Armed Services Committee, sent his first shot

across the bow of President-elect Donald Trump's national security plans Tuesday, saying that any attempt to "reset" relations with Russia is unacceptable.

"With the U.S. presidential transition underway, Vladimir Putin has said in recent days that he wants to improve relations with the United States," McCain (R-Ariz.) said in a statement released by his office. "We should place as much faith in such statements as any other made by a former KGB agent who has plunged his country into tyranny, murdered his political opponents, invaded his neighbors, threatened America's allies and attempted to undermine America's elections," he said.

Canada quietly reaches out to Russia for talks on Syria, Ukraine, 17.11.2016

Mark Gwozdecky, the foreign ministry's political director, met Russian deputy foreign minister Sergei Ryabkov on Nov 1 for talks on issues such as arms control as well as Ukraine and the war in Syria, according to the Russian foreign ministry. The visit was the first of its kind by a top Canadian official since Prime Minister Justin Trudeau's Liberals took power a year ago from the Conservatives, who imposed punitive measures over the actions of Russian-backed militants in Ukraine. The Liberals also condemn Moscow's intervention. Foreign Minister Stephane Dion on Friday urged all countries to remain firm about upholding sanctions. But they also say they want to discuss matters of mutual interest. The twin messages have Canada's foreign partners watching for any shift in policy at a time when U.S. President elect Donald Trump has indicated he will seek a rapprochement with Russia. "There are too many important issues for us, from the Arctic to the devastating situation in Syria, not to be raising those directly with them," said Joe Pickerill, chief spokesman for Dion. "Canada does not need interlocutors to raise its concerns, nor will we shout them from the sidelines. This government will raise the issues directly." Gwozdecky visited Moscow shortly before Trump's election victory.

Chubarov: Minsk can't remain venue for talks on Donbas, 17.11.2016

Head of the Mejlis of the Crimean Tatars and Ukrainian MP Refat Chubarov has said that Minsk cannot continue to be the venue for meetings and negotiations on issues related to Russia`s aggression against Ukraine. "The truth is that on the eve of the meeting (November 15, 2016) of the UN [General Assembly] Third Committee, Russia entrusted Belarus the role of a swindler, whose aim was the failure of the consideration of a draft resolution on the human rights situation in Russian-occupied Crimea," he wrote. Chubarov said that the responsibility for this role of Belarus was assigned to the official authorities of the country.

NATO PA URGES UNITED STANCE ON RUSSIA, SUPPORT FOR UKRAINE, 20.11.2016

"It is clear that conditions for an improved relationship currently do not exist; that Russia's foreign policy priorities and the values underpinning these priorities remain in fundamental conflict with those of NATO," says a report adopted by the NATO PA's Political Committee. "Through its actions and rhetoric, Russia continues to unsettle the European security environment and undermine the stability upon which Alliance security depends." Tensions with Russia and the conflict in Ukraine were a major theme on the first full day of the Assembly's annual session held this year in Istanbul. Members heard a sobering assessment from James Sherr, a Russia expert at Britain's Chatham House think tank, who warned current tensions between Moscow and the West are "more dangerous" than the Cold War. Legislators appealed for Western Allies to remain resolute and united in the face of Russian efforts to create divisions. "Against the backdrop of continued Russian provocations, maintaining a unified approach among the Allies will be crucial for our credibility and cohesion," said Lithuanian lawmaker Rasa Jukneviciene, who authored the report. "Russia is no longer the superpower it was during the Cold War, but it still wields considerable influence in the world. Russia seeks to create chaos and divide the West." Western support for Ukraine is key to thwarting Russian destabilization efforts, lawmakers said.

He said he had no legal obligation to establish boundaries between his business empire and his White House, conceding that the Trump brand "is certainly a hotter brand than it was before." Still, he said he would try to figure out a way to insulate himself from his businesses, which would be run by his children. He defended Stephen K. Bannon, his chief strategist, against charges of racism, calling him a "decent guy." And he mocked Republicans who had failed to support him in his unorthodox presidential campaign.

Germany has only modest hopes for Ukraine talks on Tuesday, 28.11.2016

There is little chance of major progress on ending fighting in eastern Ukraine, said German Foreign Minister Frank-Walter Steinmeier who is due to meet his counterparts from France, Ukraine and Russia in Minsk on Tuesday to review progress on implementing last year's ceasefire accord and on a road map the leaders of the four countries agreed to draw up in November. Ministry spokesman Martin Schaefer said Germany hoped Ukraine and Russia would agree to disengage their forces in some additional areas beyond the three "hot spots" agreed earlier. He said officials hoped to see clear signals from the Ukrainian and Russian foreign ministers that they remained committed to implementing the ceasefire accord and to constructing a road map for doing so. "I don't think it's a big secret that the expectations of Mr. Steinmeier for the meeting tomorrow are modest," Schaefer said. "Neither the intensive prenegotiations and discussions of the last months nor the public statements made by the parties provide much hope for a sensational breakthrough. We have the impression that the conflict parties have dug into their trenches and are not able to really get a handle on the ceasefire violations and stop the shooting."

Russia plotting massive destabilization in Ukraine starting Nov 15 - SBU, 11.11.2016

The SBU official noted that both the Security Service and the Foreign Intelligence Service (SZR) of Ukraine obtained operational data, which "expose plans of the Russian Federation for largescale destabilization in Ukraine, scheduled to be launched on November 15 of this year". "This intelligence is broadly in line with the content of the so-called plan of priority actions to destabilize the social and political situation in Ukraine." said Dublik. He added that the expert study of the authenticity of this plan is underway, in the framework of a relevant criminal probe. According to Dublik, the information seized from the email account of Russian Presidential Advisor Vladislav Surkov indicates the beginning of the implementation of such a plan. According to the intel of both SBU and SZR, Surkov's deputy Inal Ardzinba directly supervises and implements the plan. At the same time, the man responsible for contacts with Ukraine's political movements and certain non-governmental organizations involved in protests is Armenian citizen Mr Martirosyan. As a rule, these are false flag contacts or those promising financial reward, said Dublik. "Our agency recorded numerous trips outside of Ukraine, namely to the Russian Federation, of the organizers of rallies both to receive funding and specific instructions and details... At the same time, the enemy is counting on the effectiveness of a false flag use of the activity of a number of public organizations, which are currently holding a number of mass rallies in the capital and in other regions of the state," he said.

"Those who pulled the trigger are in the dock indeed. But those who armed them, who ordered them to slay innocent people are hiding in Moscow," the PGO chief stressed.

CRIMEAN TATARS SET UP RELIGIOUS ADMINISTRATION OF MUSLIMS OF CRIMEA IN KYIV, 22.11.2016

Kyiv hosted the assembly of delegates of the Crimean Tatar Muslim organizations in the course of which the Spiritual Administration of Muslims of Crimea was set up on mainland Ukraine. The congress was attended by 40 reps from 14 Tatar Muslim Organizations of Ukraine (Kherson region, Kyiv, Lviv, Vinnytsia), and representatives of the Mejlis and Kurultai of the Crimean Tatars. A key issue was the establishment of a single Islamic center - Muftiyat. This idea was supported unanimously, with no abstentions, no one spoke against. The established organization is assumed to promote unification and cooperation of all Crimean Tatar Muslims in mainland Ukraine. Mufti chose Ayder Rustamov. 38 delegates voted for his candidacy. Ukraine Plans Missile Drills Near Crimea Amid Threats From Russia, 30.11.2016

Ukraine plans to conduct missile test launches near the border with Russian-occupied Crimea this week amid threats from Moscow that it will launch a military strike in retaliation. Kiev's armed forces are expected to hold the training missile launches on Thursday and Friday. A spokesman for Ukraine's defense ministry said Wednesday that the exercises will take place despite threats from Russia. The Russian defense ministry warned in a letter to the Ukrainian embassy in Russia last week that Moscow's forces would shoot down Ukrainian missiles and engage missiles launchers if Kiev moved forward with the missile launches. The Russian defense ministry accused Ukraine of placing "illegal restrictions" on airspace over the Black Sea off the coast of Crimea to conduct the missile launches, according to a statement quoted by the Ukrainian Independent Information Agency. "With regard to some threats and the like, they cannot interfere with the plans of the armed forces of Ukraine and the designers of military weapons which will be carried out on the territory of a sovereign Ukraine," Andriy Lysenko, a spokesman for Ukraine's defense ministry, said Wednesday when addressing reports that Russia could launch missiles at Ukraine in retaliation for the military drills.

Ukraine broke information-related cooperation with Russia, 30.11.2016

The Ukrainian government has terminated the agreement on cooperation in the field of television and radio broadcasting with the Russian Federation. The Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine has canceled the agreement on cooperation in the field of television and radio broadcasting, previously concluded with the Russian Federation, Ukrainian Minister of Information Policy Yuriy Stets told an Ukrinform correspondent. The Minister noted that the supported resolutions provides for the abolition of the Agreement between the governments of the Russian Federation and Ukraine on cooperation in the field of television and radio broadcasting and the Agreement between the Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine and the Russian government in the field of information. In Luhansk region the SMM recorded more ceasefire violations compared with the previous day. The SMM followed up on reports of civilian casualties in Dokuchaievsk and shelling north of Sakhanka. The Mission continued to monitor the disengagement process in Stanytsia Luhanska, Zolote and Petrivske and was restricted in its freedom of movement in all three areas.* It monitored two border areas currently not under government control. It monitored repair works to essential infrastructure. The SMM continued to monitor the situation of civilians at entry-exit checkpoints along the contact line. In Kyiv the Mission monitored two protests in front of the Russian Federation Embassy.

Clashes with police reported in Kyiv amid Revolution anniversary events, 21.11.2016

About 1,000 people have gathered on Kyiv's Independence Square, or Maidan Nezalezhnosti. There are two epicenters of activity – near the Stele of Independence and on the part of the square, across Khreschatyk Street. People who have gathered near the Stele are holding flags of the Organization of Ukrainian Nationalists (OUN) and the Popular Rukh movement. One can hear recordings with patriotic songs and listen to activists' speeches. A similar picture can be seen across the street. Yet, there is live music there, as a folk group has been singing folk songs. At break, speakers discuss political topics, calling the public not to disenchant with the Revolution of Dignity and continue the struggle. No organized groups of protesters have been seen on the Maidan though. But later, some participants in the anniversary events said they wanted to bring car tires onto the square through a cordon of police, which has resulted in clashes with police officers. Some of the participants set tires on fire near the Stele.

Attack on Russian Sberbank in Kyiv: police vow to bring perpetrators to justice, 22.11.2016

The police intend to bring to justice those involved in the smashing arranged at Kyiv's branch of a Russian bank, Sberbank, on Pushkinska Street near the Leo Tolstoy Square subway station on Monday, November 21, said Chief of the Kyiv National Police Department Andriy Kryschenko. "Investigation is underway, I believe we have enough evidence, videotapes. We will be able to bring to justice those who ransacked a branch of Russian Sberbank," Kryschenko said. He noted that there were no victims in clashes with the law enforcers. Only during the rally under Sberbank, a girl was injured when she fell from atop.

OSCE sees spike in Donbas truce violations in Nov, 25.11.2016

"The situation continues to deteriorate in eastern Ukraine. In mid-November ceasefire violations reached their highest levels since the establishment of the Special Monitoring Mission in 2014," reads the statement by Deputy Mission Chief Kate Byrnes delivered at the OSCE Permanent Council meeting in Vienna. "Furthermore, the SMM recorded last week the highest-ever number of violations from heavy weapons, including multiple launch rocket systems. Combined Russian-separatist forces continue to be responsible for the majority of ceasefire violations," Byrnes said. "We call on all parties to comply fully with the Minsk agreements, including upholding the ceasefire, withdrawing proscribed weapons, making progress on disengagement, and providing the SMM full and unfettered access to all parts of Ukraine, particularly the territory controlled by combined Russian-separatist forces." She also noted that as fighting has surged, so too have threats and aggressive acts against the SMM, with nine incidents recorded over the last two months.

Separatists Say Dozhd Journalists 'Deported' From Eastern Ukraine, 26.11.2016

Separatist authorities in Donetsk said in a November 25 statement that they had "deported" Dozhd journalists Sergei Yerzhenkov and Vasily Polonsky. The announcement came after the TV channel said it had lost contact with the two men.

The statement accused the journalists of conducting "illegal journalistic activity" in areas of Donetsk controlled by the separatists, who have been fighting a bloody war with Ukrainian forces that has killed more than 9,600 since April 2014. Dozhd is known for its critical coverage of Russian President Vladimir Putin, who has denied accusations by Kyiv, NATO, and the EU that the Kremlin is backing the separatists despite substantial evidence of such support. Soldiers of the 30th brigade have recently destroyed two artillery systems and a new Russian radar locator there. The city of Dokuchaievsk does not resemble any other city across the Donbas heath. If the command was announced, militants would be encircled and within two hours Dokuchaievsk would be Ukrainian. Latest from OSCE Special Monitoring Mission (SMM) to Ukraine, 29.11.2016

The SMM recorded more ceasefire violations in Donetsk region during the reporting period and fewer in Luhansk region, compared with the previous reporting period. The SMM recorded the majority of the ceasefire violations around the Avdiivka-Yasynuvata-Donetsk airport area. The SMM continued to monitor the disengagement areas in Stanytsia Luhanska, Zolote and Petrivske, and faced restrictions of its freedom of movement in all three areas.* The SMM camera at the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge recorded at least two ceasefire violations within the disengagement area. The Mission followed up on reports of an accidental civilian casualty in Dokuchaievsk and three non-civilian casualties in Novozvanivka. It continued to monitor the withdrawal of weapons and noted weapons in violation of the withdrawal lines in government-controlled areas. The SMM monitored repairs to essential infrastructure providing water to 50,000 people in and around Toretsk.

On International Day to End Impunity for Crimes against Journalists, OSCE Representative urges States to take real steps to break cycle of impunity, 02.11.2016 On the International Day to End Impunity for Crimes Committed against Journalists the OSCE Representative on Freedom of the Media, Dunja Mijatović, called on OSCE participating States to step up their investigations and identify and prosecute those who commit crimes against journalists. "Authorities throughout the OSCE region are failing to take action to reduce the high number of attacks against journalists, and they are failing to confront the issue of impunity," Mijatović said. In December 2013, the United Nations General Assembly adopted a landmark resolution on journalist safety and proclaimed 2 November as the International Day to End Impunity. It was the first time the General Assembly adopted a resolution directly addressing journalists' safety and the issue of impunity. "This date serves as a reminder of the collaborative effort necessary to bring issues of criminal impunity to light," Mijatović said. "The grim facts are that nine out of every ten murders of journalists are never solved and that the vast majority of physical attacks against journalist are not investigated. Special Report: In Crimea, Russia signals military resolve with new and revamped bases, 01.11.2016

The missile bunkers that dot the verdant hills along Crimea's southern coast are known locally as Object 100. Until recently, tourists paid \$50 to visit the crumbling and abandoned former Soviet sites, which served during the Cold War as a defense against naval attack from the Black Sea. Now the bunkers are coming back online. After Russia took control of Crimea from Ukraine in 2014, signs went up in the woods around the sites warning visitors against entering a "forbidden zone of the Russian Ministry of Defence." A resident of a nearby village who said he was employed at the base last year said Russian soldiers had re-occupied the sites and blocked roads leading into the area. He was unable to say when the Russian soldiers arrived. "It is a functioning military base with an anti-ship missile system," the villager told a Reuters reporter who visited the area in July. The bunkers are just one small part of a new Russian program to militarize the Crimean peninsula. Based on recent site observations by Reuters, accounts from locals, media reports and official Russian data, Moscow has reanimated multiple Soviet-built facilities in the region, built new bases and stationed soldiers there. ESTONIA REPORTS SIXTH AIRSPACE VIOLATION BY RUSSIAN AIR FORCE THIS YEAR, 02.11.2016

Estonia has accused Russia's border guard of violating its airspace in what it is claiming is the sixth such violation this year. The Estonian Ministry of Defense announced via Twitter on Tuesday evening that a Russian An-148 border patrol aircraft had violated Estonian space for the sixth time in 2016. The incident took place Tuesday morning near the island of Vaindloo, Estonia's northernmost territory in the Baltic Sea. According to a statement by the Estonian Armed Forces, the aircraft's stay in Estonian airspace lasted around a minute. It was flying with its transponder switched on but there was no radio contact between the Russian crew and Estonian forces at the time of the violation, according to the statement.

Russia makes U-turn after evicting Amnesty from Moscow office, 03.11.2016

Human rights group Amnesty International can return to the Moscow office it was evicted from this week, a Kremlin human rights adviser said on Thursday after discussing the matter with President Vladimir Putin. Amnesty has been a vocal critic of Russia over its bombing campaign in Syria and had said it believed the eviction might be part of an official crackdown on civil society groups. Amnesty staff had turned up at their office in central Moscow on Wednesday morning to find the locks had been changed and the power cut off. The Moscow city government, from which Amnesty leases the premises, said it was owed rent, but the group said payments were up to date. FBI examining fake documents targeting Clinton campaign: sources, 04.11.2016

The FBI and U.S. intelligence agencies are examining faked documents aimed at discrediting the Hillary Clinton campaign as part of a broader investigation into what U.S. officials believe has been an attempt by Russia to disrupt the presidential election, people with knowledge of the matter said. U.S. Senator Tom Carper, a Democrat on the Senate Homeland Security Committee, has referred one of the documents to the FBI for investigation on the grounds that his name and stationery were forged to appear authentic. In a document forged to appear as though Carper was writing a letter to Clinton, Carper is quoted as saying the Department of Homeland Security had advised him of a risk that a "massive" cyber attack "could change the election results in favor of a specific candidate." The document dated October 3 was reviewed by Reuters. You can see a copy of the letter here: tmsnrt.rs/2emt5Al. It concludes, "Any suspicious incident will be immediately reported to your assistants so that a recount of votes could be timely organized. You will not lose the election because of some compromised electronic voting systems." The fake Carper letter is one of several documents presented to the FBI and the U.S. Department of Justice for review in recent weeks, the sources said.

Michael V. Hayden, a principal at the Chertoff Group and visiting professor at George Mason University's Schar School of Policy and Government, was director of the National Security Agency from 1999 to 2005 and the Central Intelligence Agency from 2006 to 2009. I know I'm not the first to notice this, but Donald Trump really does sound a lot like Vladimir Putin. There has always been a sympathetic authoritarian chord between the Republican presidential nominee and the Russian president. Both are on record as admiring The Strong Leader. They've even complimented one another on the trait. Putin could have been humming along when Trump was claiming "I alone can fix it" during his acceptance speech at the Republican National Convention. Maybe he was. Each seems to have a pretty conspiratorial view of the world, too. Putin comes by his naturally. Russia claims another two Ukraine "saboteurs" in occupied Crimea detained, 21.11.2016

The court in the Russian-occupied Crimea has ruled to hold in custody another two "Ukrainian saboteurs" after their detention by the FSB in a spree of arrests the Russian security service said were connected with a crackdown on an alleged subversive plot of the Ukrainian military intel against the peninsula's critical infrastructure and military bases. The occupation forces claim one of the detainees is Colonel of the Main Intelligence Directorate of Ukraine's Defense Ministry Oleksiy Stohniy. Another man arrested is allegedly a Ukrainian officer Hleb Shabliy. Russia claims that Stohniy and Shabliy have conspired with a "Shtyblikov group", the members of which had been arrested in Crimea earlier, Radio Liberty reported.

Canada adds Crimean officials to sanctions list, 29.11.2016

In order to maintain the necessary pressure on Russia until it fully complies with its international obligations with respect to Ukraine, the Special Economic Measures (Ukraine) Regulations have been amended to list 15 additional separatist individuals, including six members of Russia's State Duma from Crimea, who are subject to an asset freeze and dealings prohibition. These sanctions are in response to the September 18 election of officials residing in Crimea to Russia's State Duma. Canada does not support the legitimacy or the outcome of these elections held in the occupied Crimean peninsula, as it has never recognized Russia's illegal annexation of Ukraine's Autonomous Republic of Crimea and the city of Sevastopol. Adding more sanctions, in coordination with our partners, is the most effective way to underscore the resounding message that together with the United States and the European Union, there is unity in responding to Russia's actions in Ukraine. Canada's new measures are also designed to maintain the efficacy of existing sanctions measures, and, crucially, to maintain pressure on Russia to implement its Minsk commitments. Canada reaffirms its commitment to a policy of non-recognition of Russia's illegal annexation of Crimea.

Russian troops in Crimea on high alert following Kiev's missile launch preparations, 29.11.2016

"Ukraine's firing exercises are a sort of a PR-move aimed at creating a nervous situation but in any case the military perceive this as a real and potential threat and, therefore, the Russian air defense forces in Crimea have been placed on enhanced alert," the source said. "This refers not only to ground-based but also to shipborne air defense forces as ships of the Black Sea Fleet are self-sustained combat units for repelling any threats," the source said. The Russian aviation watchdog Rosaviatsia earlier said that Ukraine had unilaterally decided in violation of all international treaties to hold missile launches in Russia's sovereign airspace near Crimea, in the area of civil and government planes' routes, on December 1-2. Ukraine issued a NOTAM (an aviation notice) on November 24 about the activation of dangerous zones in the airspace over planned missile launches on these dates. At the same time, the issue of closing the airspace over Crimea is not on the agenda: Rosaviatsia expects the illegitimate decisions to be cancelled. http://tass.com/defense/915570

Russia deploys anti-air system in Crimea ahead of Ukraine's drills, 30.11.2016

In the afternoon of November 29, movement of Russian military convoys was recorded in the Crimean city of Kerch. Activists of the open-source intelligence "InformNapalm" community identified S-300VM "Antey-2500" anti-aircraft missile system among other military equipment spotted in military convoys moving across the occupied Crimean peninsula. Deployment of the anti-aircraft complex may be associated with an attempt to disrupt the Ukrainian missile tests over the Black Sea, scheduled for December 1-2. InformNapalm warned that the appearance of the S-300VM in Crimea, directly ahead of the missile tests scheduled by the Ukrainian side, suggest that Russia is considering two possible scenarios: to shoot down a Ukrainian missile; or to stage a provocation involving downing of a passenger plane and blaming Ukraine's missile tests.
